THE BIG DATES OF TOURNAMENT

Created in 1973, the easter week-end

An idea of André VAN DEN BRINK (category MINIMES 13/14 years, ANDERLECHT, BAYERN....) up to 1977: EUROPE MINI CUP, 3 days, just one tournament, 12 clubs; 1st final, 3500 paying spectators, accommodation in a college, without shower neither hot water, school cafeteria and financial participation travel expenses.

<u>1976</u>: Mixed tournament (clubs/nations) first French team MINIMES with Laurent ROUSSEY, final live TV on the one; holidays hollow for the nations.

<u>1977</u>: New facilities, two different tournaments: 6 nations and 9 clubs, final live TV on the one with Laurent PAGANELLI, Fabrice POULAIN; Participation of ISRAEL (security service).

1978: (MONDIAL MINIMES MONTAIGU)

<u>1979</u>: 8 nations and 8 clubs (Jean-Marc BOSMAN BELGIQUE)

1981: Tournament 12 European's nation, not club's tournament

1983: Marcel DESAILLY- 1st participation of African countries: ALGERIA

<u>1984</u>: 1st participation of BRAZIL, winner against FRANCE of Didier DESCHAMPS, in front of 9000 paying spectators; NANTES-BORDEAUX in final clubs; Holidays hollow in full board for some teams and hotels.

1985: 1st participation of URSS.

<u>1986</u>: 4 days, with the CAMEROON (winner but older), BORDEAUX winner with Christophe DUGARY.

1987: Free entrance, search partners. Defections African teams (CONGO, GHANA...)

<u>1988</u>: CHINA (regional selection) and MEXICO (winner but older and suspended by FIFA in youth competition.

<u>1992</u>: 20th anniversary, 7 days, 10 municipalities in the Canton of MONTAIGU, 16 nations and 16 Clubs which 12 Europeans.

<u>1993/94/95</u>: Tripled of CAMEROON represented by the Cameroon Brasseries. In 1993 Thierry HENRY with FRANCE.

<u>1997</u>: 25th anniversary, 32 nations on 9 days (URUGUAY, ILES FEROE, GABON, GUINEE instead of ZAIRE...) divided in 8 groups in VENDEE. FRANCE: winner with CISSE, GIVET, MEXES. 12 clubs; Budget 3.000.000 Francs (500.000 euros).

<u>1998</u>: Year of WORLD CUP, 5 continents represented (COLOMBIA, PERU, NEW ZEALAND (32 hours of travel, parents), BRAZIL 32nd favelas....; ITALY: CASSANO, GILARDINO; 8 clubs

<u>2000</u>: 1st participation of JAPAN and ARGENTINA with Carlos TEVEZ (Manchester City); 16 clubs of L1.

<u>2001</u>: 6 days (Wednesday to Monday); Cristiano RONALDO (PORTUGAL) 5 Ballons d'Or

2003: Final FRANCE/ITALY with BEN ARFA, NASRI

<u>2004</u>: 1st participation of the IVORY COAST, BENZEMA with LYON.

2005: THE SOUTH KOREA

<u>2007</u>: 35th anniversary; winner tournament (defections of ARGENTINA replaced by ROMANIA). 12 nations, 12 clubs.

<u>2009</u>: 4 news nations: AUSTRALIA, UNITED ARAB EMIRATES, MALI and QATAR represented in Clubs by THE ASPIRE ACADEMY.

2010: A new country: THE BENIN.

2012: 40th anniversary with 12 nations U16 and 12 clubs U17

<u>2013</u>: (MONDIAL FOOTBALL MONTAIGU) 1st participation of CHILI and THE MAKKAH SPORTS Academy of SAUDI ARABIA.

<u>2014</u>: 1st participation of SAUDI ARABIA. Final unpublished IVORY COAST beat THE SOUTH KOREA. 3 goals to 1, score his name to the record. KYLIAN MBAPPE play with L'AS MONACO.

2015: Arrived the official money: THE EURO MONDIAL.

2018: Participation of HAITI.

<u>2019</u>: 1st woman tournament U16 with: FRANCE (winner)- CHINA – SPAIN- NORTH KOREA; Back to SPAIN behind 20 years absence.

<u>2020</u>: Tournament cancelled in March because COVID19.

<u>2021</u>: 48th edition postponed from August 16 to 22 with 8 Clubs, 2 Women's Nations (Spain and Norway) and 2 Boys Nations (France and Spain) in the U17 category
